REPORT

On January 23, 2012 The Ministry of Finance announced the release of the Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund (OMPF) allocations for 2012. See attached announcement.

The OMPF, which replaced the Community Reinvestment Fund (CRF) in 2005, is the Province's main transfer payment to municipalities. Its objectives are to:

- assist municipalities with their social program costs;
- support areas with limited property assessment;
- · address challenges faced by northern and rural communities; and
- respond to policing costs in rural communities.

As part of the Provincial–Municipal Fiscal Service Delivery Review and beginning in 2008, Niagara started to receive uploading benefit from the province. Since that time, municipal benefits have been calculated as a combination of both OMPF grants and provincial uploads. In 2010 Niagara stopped receiving OMPF funding. The attached appendix 1 illustrates the uploads to date as well as the uses of the upload.

Starting in 2012, the combined upload benefit includes the upload of court security and prisoner transportation costs, as well as additional Ontario Works administration funding provided by the Province. In the 2012 Regional budget, the Ontario Works upload will continue to be used to help offset the costs of rising caseloads, whereas the new upload for court security costs will be allocated to help reduce the police employee future benefit liability.

Also attached to this report (Appendix 2) is an aggregation of the OMPF announcements for the Region's 12 local municipalities. The OMPF data sheets include funding for the following areas: OMPF Grant Components, Transitional Assistance and other Ongoing Provincial Support Payments. For purposes of this report OMPF funding is considered to be comprised of OMPF grant components and transitional assistance. The total amount expected to be received in aggregate for the local municipalities' amounts to \$13 million. This is a reduction of \$688 thousand or 5% lower than what was received in 2011. Also included on this schedule are the amounts included for other ongoing provincial supports of gas tax revenue for those eligible municipalities (\$5.4M).
