



















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1.0 Introduction




Figure 1.1 – EA Study Area

Niagara Region is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study (EA) for intersection improvements and potential realignment of Regional Road 14 (Thirty Road) at Young Street in the Township of West Lincoln. The main objective of the study is to address the need for operational and safety improvements at the intersection. The Study Area extends approximately 600 meters in each direction, as shown in the key plan in Figure 1.1.

R.V. Anderson Associates Limited (RVA) was retained by the Niagara Region to complete the Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for this project. This is a Schedule "C" project that covers phases 1 through 4 of the planning process in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, amended in 2007, 2011, 2015 & 2023). As part of the Class EA planning and design process, extensive public and technical agency consultation is required in developing the study recommendations. Two (2) Public Information Centres (PICs) are being held as part of the study.

1.1 Public Information Center #1

Public participation is key to the success of this study. The Region is keeping the community safe by complying with regional and provincial guidelines, supporting physical distancing, and postponing in-person public meetings. As such, the first PIC was held on March 9, 2023, at 6 p.m. through a Virtual Public Meeting format hosted on the Microsoft Teams Meeting, which included a formal presentation and question and answer period. Residents were invited to call-in to the meeting or participate in the meeting through a link posted to the project webpage.

The PIC included a presentation of the study to date, including existing conditions, the evaluation of alternative solutions, and preliminary recommendations, followed by a question-and-answer period. Members of the project team, which included staff from the Region and R.V. Anderson Associates Limited, were present to discuss the projects and concerns brought forwards by the attendees.

2.0 Stakeholders and Notification

In accordance with the MCEA process, notification to the public and stakeholders is required for public consultation. Notification of the PIC was provided through various avenues, as outlined below:

General Public

- Notice advertised on the Niagara This Week and NewsNow (local newspaper) on February 23rd and March 2nd, 2023.
- Notice posted on the Region of Niagara website at https://www.niagararegion.ca/projects/regional-road-14/default.aspx on February 23, 2023.

Local Residents & Businesses

- Notice mailed to the 143 property owners adjacent to the study area (catchment area included in Appendix 1-2) on February 23rd, 2023.
- Project Mailing List (Technical Agencies, Local Interest Groups, Indigenous Communities, and other parties who previously submitted comments or indicated interests in the project)
 - Email containing the Notice and details of PIC #1 sent on February 23rd, 2023.
 - Emails containing cover letters and the Notice of PIC #1 sent to Indigenous communities, specifically Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation;
 Haudenosaunee Development Institute; and Six Nations of the Grand River Elected Council.

Refer to Appendix 1 for copies of the published notifications and project mailing list.

3.0 Consultation Material

The purpose of the first PIC was to provide an overview of the Study, including the problem and opportunities to be addressed, existing conditions within the study area, the alternative solutions and evaluation criteria considered, as well as the preliminary recommendations.

The display boards presented at the first PIC are included in **Appendix 2** and presented information on the following study components:

Materials posted to the project website were available in an alternate format (i.e., hard copy) upon request, however no requests were received.

4.0 Meeting Format and Participation

Based on the Microsoft Teams Meeting Attendance Report, a total of ten (10) residents attended the PIC. Residents were encouraged to submit their questions using the Microsoft Teams Q & A function, or by using the "Raise Your Hand" feature, to ask a question directly to the project team. Questions submitted using the Q & A feature were read aloud to the project team by an RVA moderator and answered during the meeting by the project team technical staff.

A total of two (2) comments and questions were received through the Q & A function, with six (6) residents providing their comments / question directly to the project team using the "Raise Your Hand" feature.

5.0 Questions and Comments

Following the PIC, the presentation slides were available for review and comment until March 30, 2023, on the Region's website. A total of two (2) comment forms were completed following the first PIC, with some additional feedback being provided through email. The comments received during and following the PIC are summarized in **Table 5.1**, while copies of all comment forms and additional feedback submitted via email are provided in **Appendix 3**.

6.0 Conclusions and Next Steps

The PIC provided an introduction of the project to the community and provided an opportunity for interested parties to provide their input. Comments on the various topics were received, with a number of trends becoming evident. Some of these trends are as follows:

- General support for the preferred solution to implement improvements to Thirty Road at Young Street intersection, and closure of Clayson Road;
- Residents expressed the need to consider future traffic volumes associated with the Smithville Urban Boundary Expansion and potential Smithville Bypass and other networks improvements; and
- Residents expressed the need to accommodate farm and heavy truck vehicles.

All comments received during the first PIC, as well as comments received after the first PIC via email and comment form of the project webpage, will be considered by the project team as alternatives in conjunction with the findings from the existing conditions review to implement the preferred solution which is developed and evaluated in Phase 3 of the EA.

6.1 Public Information Centre (#2)

The next PIC will be held in Fall 2023. The purpose of the second PIC will be to present and obtain comments on the alternative and recommended design concepts to implement the preferred solution.

An Environmental Study Report will be prepared following the second PIC incorporating comments received from stakeholders. The report will be made available to the public for review in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment.















It is now a far safer intersection for all motorists. Clayson Road has been labeled as a "cutthrough" making it almost sound like motorists using it are breaking the law. Quite simply, Clayson Road is used by traffic because it is a maintained road and offered better visibility and safety. Turning north on Thirty Road from westbound Young Street or turning east on Young street from southbound Thirty Road is very difficult due to the angle of the main intersection. The biggest problem with safety at the intersection of Clayson Road and Thirty Road is the angle at which those 2 roads meet causing visibility issues looking south over your shoulder toward the main intersection. 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Afternoon Councillor Witteveen,

Thank you for taking the time to reach out regarding the recent PIC #1 for the Thirty Rd (RR14) - Young St. EA.

As you correctly point out, this intersection was recently upgraded to an all-way stop (November 2022). This change was made as the frequency of collisions has continued to persist since the original warrant evaluation back in ~2019. While it is obviously early-days and longer-term evaluation is still required, the all-way stop does appear to be an early safety improvement, and we're glad to hear that you've heard the same perspective from residents.

The core purpose of the EA is to examine what, if any, additional safety improvements can also be made beyond the provision of the all-way stop. At PIC #1, we examined the potential options for realignment of the road network - recommending that given the constraints (not least of which are the hydro poles) that we would not carry forward any significant realignment of Thirty Rd or Young St.

The next phase of the EA will be to evaluate alternatives for the intersection itself (i.e., maintain the all-way stop, signalize, and roundabout) and recommend any changes that can be made to improve sightlines and the safety of the existing approaches. Those alternatives will be presented at the next PIC - anticipated for Q3 of this year - and we will be sure to pass on the invite as soon as a date and time are set.

Any improvements recommended through the EA will be subject to future budgets as they are not incorporated within our 10-year capital forecast. Accordingly, I would currently anticipate, and subject to the full results of the EA, that the all-way stop will remain in place for the near and medium term. We will continue to monitor operations and then move forward with the recommendations of the EA if the current all-way stop be shown not to have addressed or reduced the frequency of collisions.

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1.0 INTRODUCTION




Figure 1.1 – EA Study Area

Niagara Region is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study (EA) for intersection improvements and potential realignment of Thirty Road (Regional Road 14) at Young Street in the Township of West Lincoln. The main objective of the study is to address the need for operational and safety improvements at the intersection. The Study Area extends approximately 600 meters in each direction, as shown in the key plan in Figure 1.1.

R.V. Anderson Associates Limited (RVA) was retained by the Niagara Region to complete the Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for this project. This is a Schedule "C" project that covers Phases 1 through 4 of the planning process in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, amended in 2007, 2011, 2015 & 2023). As part of the Class EA planning and design process, extensive public and technical agency consultation is required in developing the study recommendations. Two (2) Public Information Centres (PICs) are being held as part of the study.

1.1 Public Information Center #2

Public participation is key to the success of this study. As such, the second PIC was held on November 22, 2023, at 6 p.m. through a Virtual Public Meeting format hosted on Microsoft Teams, which included a formal presentation and a question-and-answer period. Residents were invited to call-in to the meeting or participate in the meeting through a link posted to the project webpage.

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The PIC included a presentation of the study to date, including existing conditions, the evaluation of alternative design concepts, preliminary and interim design recommendations, followed by a question-and-answer period. Members of the project team, which included staff from the Region and R.V. Anderson Associates Limited, were present to discuss the project and concerns brought forward by the attendees.

2.0 STAKEHOLDERS AND NOTIFICATION

In accordance with the MCEA process, notification to the public and stakeholders is required for public consultation. Notification of the PIC was provided through various avenues, as outlined below:

General Public

- Notice advertised in *News Now* using tear sheets in the November 9th, 2023, and November 16th, 2023, publications.
- A digital advertisement was published in *Niagara This Week* from November 8th, 2023, to November 22, 2023.
- Notice posted on the Region of Niagara website at https://www.niagararegion.ca/projects/regional-road-14/default.aspx on November 8th, 2023.

Local Residents & Businesses

- o It came to the attention of the project team that the Notice of PIC #2 was not mailed out to residents prior to PIC #2. Therefore, the Notice was mailed out on December 4th, 2023, with a cover letter notifying residents that PIC #2 materials are available online for review and that the comment period has been extended to January 3rd, 2024. This letter and Notice were mailed to the 143 property owners adjacent to the study area (catchment area included in **Appendix 1-2**).
- Project Mailing List (Technical Agencies, Local Interest Groups, Indigenous Communities, and other parties who previously submitted comments or indicated interests in the project)
 - Email containing the Notice and details of PIC #2 sent on November 9th,
 2023.
 - Emails containing cover letters and the Notice of PIC #2 sent to Indigenous communities, specifically Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation,

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Haudenosaunee Development Institute, and Six Nations of the Grand River Elected Council.

Refer to Appendix 1 for copies of the published notifications and project mailing list.

3.0 CONSULTATION MATERIAL

The purpose of the second PIC was to provide a refresher on existing conditions in the Study Area, ongoing key studies being undertaken, and present and obtain comments on the alternative and recommended designs for the intersection.

The display boards presented at the second PIC are included in **Appendix 2** and presented information on the following study components:

- Study Area & Objectives
- Policy & Planning Background
- Work Completed to Date
- Problem & Opportunity Statement

- Key Studies
- Existing Conditions
- Alternative Design Concepts and Preliminary Recommended Design
- Next Steps

Display boards were posted to the project webpage following the PIC.

4.0 MEETING FORMAT AND PARTICIPATION

Based on the Microsoft Teams Meeting Attendance Report, a total of seven (7) residents attended the PIC. Residents were encouraged to submit their questions using the Microsoft Teams Q & A function, or by using the "Raise Your Hand" feature, to ask a question directly to the project team. Questions submitted using the Q & A feature were read aloud to the project team by an RVA moderator and answered during the meeting by the project team technical staff.

A total of twenty (20) comments and questions were received through the Q & A and Chat functions of the meeting, with one (1) resident providing their comments / question directly to the project team using the "Raise Your Hand" feature.

5.0 QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS

Following the PIC, the presentation slides were available for review and comment until January 3rd, 2024, on the Region's website. A total of two (2) comment forms were

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completed following the first PIC, with some additional feedback being provided through email. The comments received during and following the PIC are summarized in Table 1, while copies of all comment forms and additional feedback submitted via email are provided in **Appendix 3**.

6.0 POST PIC #2 DESIGN MODIFICATIONS

6.1 Interim Solution

An interim solution was developed as part of Phase 3 alternative design concepts. The interim solution is to be implemented until budget allows for the preferred roundabout configuration to be implemented. In the interim solution, the Thirty Road at Young Street intersection remains at a 4-way stop and Clayson Road becomes northbound one-way only north of the Smithville Yard entrance and is realigned to allow for better sightlines for traffic turning north onto Thirty Road.

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


Figure 6.1 Revised Interim Solution

The interim solution was presented at PIC #2 and meeting attendees provided feedback regarding the configuration, as summarized in Table 1. As such, modifications were made to the interim solution in consideration of these comments. The revised interim solution is shown in Figure 6.1. Modifications included widening the paved shoulders at the Thirty Road and Young Street intersection to accommodate large trucks travelling southbound on Thirty Road and making a left turn onto eastbound Young Street.

6.2 Meetings with Impacted Property Owners

Property owners and residents at the corners of the Thirty Road and Young Street intersection were sent letters highlighting the recommended design concept and anticipated property impacts. The letter also requested an opportunity to meet so that property impacts can be discussed.




Figure 6.2 Revised Roundabout Configuration

To date, a meeting was held with the owners of 3094 Thirty Road, the southwest corner of the intersection, on January 11, 2024. The owners supported the recommended roundabout configuration and requested a new location for the proposed second driveway on their property to maintain

full in/out movements from their property. As such, the recommended roundabout configuration, Alternative 5: Roundabout Intersection with Thirty Road Realigned South of Windfarm Poles was revised to accommodate the owners' request, see Figure 6.2.

The revised design concepts are available in **Appendix 4**.

7.0 CONCLUSIONS AND NEXT STEPS

The PIC provided a review of the study area, existing conditions, problem and opportunity statement, key studies, and an overview and evaluation of the design alternatives with the preliminary recommended design and interim solution. Comments on various topics were received, with a number of trends becoming evident. Some of these trends are as follows:

- There is general support for the current short- to mid-term all-way stop solution implemented;
- Residents expressed their concerns regarding large farm vehicle turning movements through roundabouts and current intersection configurations at Thirty Road and Young Street;
- There is general support for minor modifications to be made in the study area to improve traffic operations and safety as an interim solution, while providing consideration to large vehicles and farming equipment.

All comments received during the second PIC, as well as comments received after the second PIC via email and comment form of the project webpage, will be considered by the project team when finalizing the preferred design concept to be implemented in conjunction with the findings from key studies.

7.1 Environmental Study Report

The next step in the EA planning process is to document the key planning decisions and comments received from stakeholders, technical agencies, and the public in an Environmental Study Report. The Environmental Study Report will document the evaluation completed in Phase 2 and 3 of the EA planning process that led the project team to the preferred solution and design concept to implement the solution.

The report will be made available to the public for review in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment in Q1/Q2 of 2024.





- Reverse curve alignment of Thirty Road causing insufficient stopping sightline distance at Young Street and maneuverability issues for larger farm vehicles and commercial trucks;
- Right-of-way conflict at Thirty Road and Clayson Road;
- Westbound traffic utilizing Clayson Road as a cut-through to avoid Thirty Road at Young Street intersection
- Lack of pedestrian and cyclist facilities











- Restricts SB Left Turn movement onto Clayson Road
- Region to monitor traffic operations in the area

For those not familiar with South Grimsby Rd. 3, it is a gravel road approx. 2.5 miles long. The southern Ž appears to be a routine municipal gravel road (normal road allowance, I think) but the northern half is not…it is a "given" road that only has a 32-foot road allowance and a usable road track of less than 20 ft. In addition to this it has two -sharp- 90 degree (obscured) turns where we routinely experience vehicles going off the road due to speed and or reckless actions. Traffic has been increasing steadily since the Windfarm Powerline Project and now we are seeing a marked increase in heavy Truck traffic since the installation of the 4-way stop which has been welcomed by most of the neighbours I have spoken with. This was a very dangerous corner that has seen numerous accidents over the years…it took way too long to correct that situation. Subject: Intersection improvements at Thirty Road and Young Street

To; Project Team members and Regional Council representatives of West Lincoln.

My name is and I reside at study area but very close to it. I am a lifelong resident and have experienced this intersection for many years, in my personal vehicles and for many years while operating a commercial trucking business in the area. I am also involved in the agricultural community and very familiar with the movement of agricultural equipment in the area of this intersection. I have participated in both Public Information Centres regarding improvements at this intersection and respectfully submit the following observations and comments for consideration by the project team.

The design and sightlines of the main intersection of Thirty Road and Young Street has been problematic for as long as I can remember, even before I became a licenced driver. Sightlines for westbound traffic looking north or south on Young Street trying to cross or turn south on Thirty Road were extremely inadequate and have resulted in many accidents in that intersection. The bend of Thirty Road at that intersection also has

resulted in many vehicles leaving the roadway due to excessive speed and the less than perfect geometrics of the curve while going through the intersection on Thirty Road. The implementation of a "temporary" four way stop at this intersection has improved safety greatly and it is unfortunate that this solution was not implemented decades ago. Niagara Region has admitted that accidents at this intersection have dropped substantially since the four way stop was installed and I have not spoken with anyone yet that hasn't commented favorable on the improvement. Traffic wishing to head north on Thirty Road from a westbound direction has always used Clayson Road as the main intersection has never allowed for a turn in that direction to be made safely. I disagree with the reference by project staff that vehicles are using Clayson Road as a "cut through" as it implies to me that motorists using Clayson Road are using it as a short-cut or something bordering illegal in some way. Clayson Road is being used now as a public road, just the same as it has for many decades, even before the S-bend portion of Thirty Road was constructed. Traffic on Clayson Road has increased greatly since the Township of West Lincoln improved Industrial Park Road through to Young Street. Improvements to traffic flow in this area were proposed to coincide with the upgrade of Industrial Park Road but were never acted upon.

In the short term, the project team has proposed to realign the intersection of Clayson Road and Young Street and make it "one way" northbound only at this intersection. The turning of vehicles from southbound Thirty Road onto eastbound Young Street would be less than ideal and almost impossible for large trucks, tractor trailers to negotiate while trying to access the Industrial Park as well as the 2 guarries on Young Street. I have not heard of any traffic accidents at this intersection in the past, and I wonder if the proposed realignment of the intersection is necessary. I use this intersection on a regular basis and feel that safety could be improved slightly in 2 ways. For traffic heading southbound onto Clayson Road from Thirty Road, I find that sightlines to see traffic headed northbound on Thirty Road would be improved by the removal or leveling of the piles of dirt that are currently being created by Niagara Region Public Works on the land opposite the Public Works Yard. I also find it difficult to look backwards for approaching northbound traffic on Thirty Road when trying to enter from Clayson Road. This is made most difficult when stopped at the current stop sign. If the stop sign was moved a little further back from the intersection it would be much easier to see this approaching traffic. My preference would be to try making these changes as I have suggested to improve sightlines at the intersection of Clayson Road and Thirty Road with no further changes to the roadway. If the intersection of Clayson Road and Thirty Road is eventually realigned, it must continue to support 2 way traffic at that intersection.

In the eventual case that the Niagara Region chooses to make major improvements at the intersection of Thirty Road and Young Street, I support the realignment of Thirty Road as proposed in Option 5 and the closing of Clayson Road, but I do not support the construction of a roundabout at this location and feel that the continued use of a 4 way stop is very sufficient. I do not support the concept of a roundabout here for several reasons. I feel that the construction of an intersection any more elaborate and substantial is not warranted due to the excessive increase in cost, the encroachment on the residential properties adjacent to the intersection which involves extensive redesigning of driveway accesses across their front yards, as well as the increase in difficulty of the movement of large agricultural equipment that uses this intersection. I also feel that substantial expenditures in the construction of a roundabout at this location are very premature as there has not been a transportation plan completed that involves how traffic patterns will be affected in this area once a proposed Niagara Escarpment Crossing combined with a Smithville Bypass route are studied, evaluated and eventually built. Only after these future projects are closer to reality and the Town of Smithville along with the Industrial Park expansion are realized, can a truly educated and well thought out major improvement to this intersection be considered.


In summary, I feel that massive improvements to safety at this intersection have already been successful with minimum expense to date, which is good for motorists, nearby residents, and taxpayers as well. A project cost for the preferred concept was estimated by the project team to be approximately \$7 million. I feel that small improvements can, and have been made with relatively minor expense and this major expenditure is certainly not warranted currently at this intersection.



This letter is in response to the Notice of Commencement for the above noted project. The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) acknowledges that Niagara Region has indicated that the study is following the approved environmental planning process for a Schedule C project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA).

The **updated** (**February 2021**) attached "Areas of Interest" document provides guidance regarding the ministry's interests with respect to the Class EA process. Please address all areas of interest in the EA documentation at an appropriate level for the EA study. Proponents who address all the applicable areas of interest can minimize potential delays to the project schedule. **Further information is provided at the end of the Areas of Interest document relating to recent changes to the Environmental Assessment Act through Bill 197, Covid-19 Economic Recovery Act 2020.**

The Crown has a legal duty to consult Aboriginal communities when it has knowledge, real or constructive, of the existence or potential existence of an Aboriginal or treaty right and contemplates conduct that may adversely impact that right. Before authorizing this project, the Crown must ensure that its duty to consult has been fulfilled, where such a duty is triggered. Although the duty to consult with Aboriginal peoples is a duty of the Crown, the Crown may delegate procedural aspects of this duty to project proponents while retaining oversight of the consultation process.

The proposed project may have the potential to affect Aboriginal or treaty rights protected under Section 35 of Canada's *Constitution Act* 1982. Where the Crown's duty to consult is triggered in relation to the proposed project, **the MECP is delegating the procedural aspects of rights-based**

consultation to the proponent through this letter. The Crown intends to rely on the delegated consultation process in discharging its duty to consult and maintains the right to participate in the consultation process as it sees fit.

Based on information provided to date and the Crown's preliminary assessment the proponent is required to consult with the following communities who have been identified as potentially affected by the proposed project:

- Mississaugas of the Credit River First Nation
- Six Nations of the Grand River (Elected Council and Haudenosaunee Confederacy Chiefs Council with a copy to Haudenosaunee Development Institute)

Steps that the proponent may need to take in relation to Aboriginal consultation for the proposed project are outlined in the "Code of Practice for Consultation in Ontario's Environmental Assessment Process". Additional information related to Ontario's Environmental Assessment Act is available online at: www.ontario.ca/environmentalassessments.

Please also refer to the attached document "A Proponent's Introduction to the Delegation of Procedural Aspects of consultation with Aboriginal Communities" for further information, including the MECP's expectations for EA report documentation related to consultation with communities.

The proponent must contact the Director of Environmental Assessment Branch (EABDirector@ontario.ca) under the following circumstances subsequent to initial discussions with the communities identified by MECP:

- Aboriginal or treaty rights impacts are identified to you by the communities
- You have reason to believe that your proposed project may adversely affect an Aboriginal or treaty right
- Consultation with Indigenous communities or other stakeholders has reached an impasse
- A Part II Order request is expected on the basis of impacts to Aboriginal or treaty rights

The MECP will then assess the extent of any Crown duty to consult for the circumstances and will consider whether additional steps should be taken, including what role you will be asked to play should additional steps and activities be required.

A draft copy of the report should be sent directly to me prior to the filing of the final report, allowing a minimum of 30 days for the ministry's technical reviewers to provide comments.

Please also ensure a copy of the final notice is sent to the ministry's West Central Region EA notification email account (eanotification.wcregion@ontario.ca) after the draft report is reviewed and finalized.

A Proponent's Introduction to the Delegation of Procedural Aspects of Consultation with Aboriginal Communities

- Projects located in MECP Central Region are subject to <u>A Place to Grow: Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe</u> (2020). Parts of the study area may also be subject to the <u>Oak Ridges Moraine Conservation Plan</u> (2017), <u>Niagara Escarpment Plan</u> (2017), <u>Greenbelt Plan</u> (2017) or <u>Lake Simcoe Protection Plan</u> (2014). Applicable plans and the applicable policies should be identified in the report, and the proponent should <u>describe</u> how the proposed project adheres to the relevant policies in these plans.
- The <u>Provincial Policy Statement</u> (2020) contains policies that protect Ontario's natural heritage and water resources. Applicable policies should be referenced in the report, and the proponent should <u>describe</u> how the proposed project is consistent with these policies.

□ Source Water Protection

The Clean Water Act, 2006 (CWA) aims to protect existing and future sources of drinking water. To achieve this, several types of vulnerable areas have been delineated around surface water intakes and wellheads for every municipal residential drinking water system that is located in a source protection area. These vulnerable areas are known as a Wellhead Protection Areas (WHPAs) and surface water Intake Protection Zones (IPZs). Other vulnerable areas that have been delineated under the CWA include Highly Vulnerable Aquifers (HVAs), Significant Groundwater Recharge Areas (SGRAs), Event-based modelling areas (EBAs), and Issues Contributing Areas (ICAs). Source protection plans have been developed that include policies to address existing and future risks to sources of municipal drinking water within these vulnerable areas.

Projects that are subject to the Environmental Assessment Act that fall under a Class EA, or one of the Regulations, have the potential to impact sources of drinking water if they occur in designated vulnerable areas or in the vicinity of other at-risk drinking water systems (i.e. systems that are not municipal residential systems). MEA Class EA projects may include activities that, if located in a vulnerable area, could be a threat to sources of drinking water (i.e. have the potential to adversely affect the quality or quantity of drinking water sources) and the activity could therefore be subject to policies in a source protection plan. Where an activity poses a risk to drinking water, policies in the local source protection plan may impact how or where that activity is undertaken. Policies may prohibit certain activities, or they may require risk management measures for these activities. Municipal Official Plans, planning decisions, Class EA projects (where the project includes an activity that is a threat to drinking water) and prescribed instruments must conform with policies that address significant risks to drinking water and must have regard for policies that address moderate or low risks.

- In October 2015, the MEA Parent Class EA document was amended to include reference to the Clean Water Act (Section A.2.10.6) and indicates that proponents undertaking a Municipal Class EA project must identify early in their process whether a project is or could potentially be occurring with a vulnerable area. Given this requirement, please include a section in the report on source water protection.
 - The proponent should identify the source protection area and should clearly document how the proximity of the project to sources of drinking water (municipal or other) and any delineated vulnerable areas was considered and assessed. Specifically, the report should discuss whether or not the project is located in a vulnerable area and provide applicable details about the area.

- o If located in a vulnerable area, proponents should document whether any project activities are prescribed drinking water threats and thus pose a risk to drinking water (this should be consulted on with the appropriate Source Protection Authority). Where an activity poses a risk to drinking water, the proponent must document and discuss in the report how the project adheres to or has regard to applicable policies in the local source protection plan. This section should then be used to inform and be reflected in other sections of the report, such as the identification of net positive/negative effects of alternatives, mitigation measures, evaluation of alternatives etc.
- While most source protection plans focused on including policies for significant drinking water threats
 in the WHPAs and IPZs it should be noted that even though source protection plan policies may not
 apply in HVAs, these are areas where aquifers are sensitive and at risk to impacts and within these
 areas, activities may impact the quality of sources of drinking water for systems other than municipal
 residential systems.

□ Climate Change

The document "Considering Climate Change in the Environmental Assessment Process" (Guide) is now a part of the Environmental Assessment program's Guides and Codes of Practice. The Guide sets out the MECP's expectation for considering climate change in the preparation, execution and documentation of environmental assessment studies and processes. The guide provides examples, approaches, resources, and references to assist proponents with consideration of climate change in EA. Proponents should review this Guide in detail.

• The MECP expects proponents of Class EA projects to:

- 1. Consider during the assessment of alternative solutions and alternative designs, the following:
 - a. the project's expected production of greenhouse gas emissions and impacts on carbon sinks (climate change mitigation); and
 - b. resilience or vulnerability of the undertaking to changing climatic conditions (climate change adaptation).
- 2. Include a discrete section in the report detailing how climate change was considered in the EA.

How climate change is considered can be qualitative or quantitative in nature and should be scaled to the project's level of environmental effect. In all instances, both a project's impacts on climate change (mitigation) and impacts of climate change on a project (adaptation) should be considered.

• The MECP has also prepared another guide to support provincial land use planning direction related to the completion of energy and emission plans. The "Community Emissions Reduction Planning: A Guide for Municipalities" document is designed to educate stakeholders on the municipal opportunities to reduce energy and greenhouse gas emissions, and to provide guidance on methods and techniques to incorporate consideration of energy and greenhouse gas emissions into municipal activities of all types. We encourage you to review the Guide for information.

□ Air Quality, Dust and Noise

- If there are sensitive receptors in the surrounding area of this project, a quantitative air quality/odour impact assessment will be useful to evaluate alternatives, determine impacts and identify appropriate mitigation measures. The scope of the assessment can be determined based on the potential effects of the proposed alternatives, and typically includes source and receptor characterization and a quantification of local air quality impacts on the sensitive receptors and the environment in the study area. The assessment will compare to all applicable standards or guidelines for all contaminants of concern. Please contact this office for further consultation on the level of Air Quality Impact Assessment required for this project if not already advised.
- If a quantitative Air Quality Impact Assessment is not required for the project, the MECP expects that the report contain a qualitative assessment which includes:
 - A discussion of local air quality including existing activities/sources that significantly impact local air quality and how the project may impact existing conditions;
 - A discussion of the nearby sensitive receptors and the project's potential air quality impacts on present and future sensitive receptors;
 - A discussion of local air quality impacts that could arise from this project during both construction and operation; and
 - A discussion of potential mitigation measures.
- As a common practice, "air quality" should be used an evaluation criterion for all road projects.
- Dust and noise control measures should be addressed and included in the construction plans to
 ensure that nearby residential and other sensitive land uses within the study area are not adversely
 affected during construction activities.
- The MECP recommends that non-chloride dust-suppressants be applied. For a comprehensive list of fugitive dust prevention and control measures that could be applied, refer to <u>Cheminfo Services Inc.</u> <u>Best Practices for the Reduction of Air Emissions from Construction and Demolition Activities</u> report prepared for Environment Canada. March 2005.
- The report should consider the potential impacts of increased noise levels during the operation of the completed project. The proponent should explore all potential measures to mitigate significant noise impacts during the assessment of alternatives.

□ Ecosystem Protection and Restoration

- Any impacts to ecosystem form and function must be avoided where possible. The report should describe any proposed mitigation measures and how project planning will protect and enhance the local ecosystem.
- Natural heritage and hydrologic features should be identified and described in detail to assess
 potential impacts and to develop appropriate mitigation measures. The following sensitive
 environmental features may be located within or adjacent to the study area:

- Key Natural Heritage Features: Habitat of endangered species and threatened species, fish habitat, wetlands, areas of natural and scientific interest (ANSIs), significant valleylands, significant woodlands; significant wildlife habitat (including habitat of special concern species); sand barrens, savannahs, and tallgrass prairies; and alvars.
- Key Hydrologic Features: Permanent streams, intermittent streams, inland lakes and their littoral zones, seepage areas and springs, and wetlands.
- Other natural heritage features and areas such as: vegetation communities, rare species of flora or fauna, Environmentally Sensitive Areas, Environmentally Sensitive Policy Areas, federal and provincial parks and conservation reserves, Greenland systems etc.

We recommend consulting with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF), Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) and your local conservation authority to determine if special measures or additional studies will be necessary to preserve and protect these sensitive features. In addition, you may consider the provisions of the Rouge Park Management Plan if applicable.

□ Species at Risk

- The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks has now assumed responsibility of Ontario's Species at Risk program. Information, standards, guidelines, reference materials and technical resources to assist you are found at https://www.ontario.ca/page/species-risk.
- The Client's Guide to Preliminary Screening for Species at Risk (Draft May 2019) has been attached to the covering email for your reference and use. Please review this document for next steps.
- For any questions related to subsequent permit requirements, please contact <u>SAROntario@ontario.ca</u>.

☐ Surface Water

- The report must include enough information to demonstrate that there will be no negative impacts on the natural features or ecological functions of any watercourses within the study area. Measures should be included in the planning and design process to ensure that any impacts to watercourses from construction or operational activities (e.g. spills, erosion, pollution) are mitigated as part of the proposed undertaking.
- Additional stormwater runoff from new pavement can impact receiving watercourses and flood conditions. Quality and quantity control measures to treat stormwater runoff should be considered for all new impervious areas and, where possible, existing surfaces. The ministry's <u>Stormwater Management Planning and Design Manual (2003)</u> should be referenced in the report and utilized when designing stormwater control methods. A <u>Stormwater Management Plan should be prepared as part of the Class EA process</u> that includes:
 - Strategies to address potential water quantity and erosion impacts related to stormwater draining into streams or other sensitive environmental features, and to ensure that adequate (enhanced) water quality is maintained
 - Watershed information, drainage conditions, and other relevant background information
 - Future drainage conditions, stormwater management options, information on erosion and sediment control during construction, and other details of the proposed works
 - Information on maintenance and monitoring commitments.
- Ontario Regulation 60/08 under the Ontario Water Resources Act (OWRA) applies to the Lake Simcoe Basin, which encompasses Lake Simcoe and the lands from which surface water drains into Lake Simcoe. If the proposed sewage treatment plant is listed in Table 1 of the regulation, the report should describe how the proposed project and its mitigation measures are consistent with the requirements of this regulation and the OWRA.

Any potential approval requirements for surface water taking or discharge should be identified in the
report. A Permit to Take Water (PTTW) under the OWRA will be required for any water takings that
exceed 50,000 L/day, except for certain water taking activities that have been prescribed by the Water
Taking EASR Regulation – O. Reg. 63/16. These prescribed water-taking activities require registration
in the EASR instead of a PTTW. Please review the Water Taking User Guide for EASR for more
information. Additionally, an Environmental Compliance Approval under the OWRA is required for
municipal stormwater management works.

□ Groundwater

- The status of, and potential impacts to any well water supplies should be addressed. If the project involves groundwater takings or changes to drainage patterns, the quantity and quality of groundwater may be affected due to drawdown effects or the redirection of existing contamination flows. In addition, project activities may infringe on existing wells such that they must be reconstructed or sealed and abandoned. Appropriate information to define existing groundwater conditions should be included in the report.
- If the potential construction or decommissioning of water wells is identified as an issue, the report should refer to Ontario Regulation 903, Wells, under the OWRA.
- Potential impacts to groundwater-dependent natural features should be addressed. Any changes to
 groundwater flow or quality from groundwater taking may interfere with the ecological processes of
 streams, wetlands or other surficial features. In addition, discharging contaminated or high volumes of
 groundwater to these features may have direct impacts on their function. Any potential effects should
 be identified, and appropriate mitigation measures should be recommended. The level of detail
 required will be dependent on the significance of the potential impacts.
- Any potential approval requirements for groundwater taking or discharge should be identified in the
 report. A Permit to Take Water (PTTW) under the OWRA will be required for any water takings that
 exceed 50,000 L/day, with the exception of certain water taking activities that have been prescribed
 by the Water Taking EASR Regulation O. Reg. 63/16. These prescribed water-taking activities
 require registration in the EASR instead of a PTTW. Please review the Water Taking User Guide for
 EASR for more information.
- Consultation with the railroad authorities is necessary wherever there is a plan to use construction dewatering in the vicinity of railroad lines or where the zone of influence of the construction dewatering potentially intercepts railroad lines.

□ Excess Materials Management

• In December 2019, MECP released a new regulation under the Environmental Protection Act, titled "On-Site and Excess Soil Management" (O. Reg. 406/19) to support improved management of excess construction soil. This regulation is a key step to support proper management of excess soils, ensuring valuable resources don't go to waste and to provide clear rules on managing and reusing excess soil. New risk-based standards referenced by this regulation help to facilitate local beneficial reuse which in turn will reduce greenhouse gas emissions from soil transportation, while ensuring strong protection of human health and the environment. The new regulation is being phased in over time, with the first phase in effect on January 1, 2021. For more information, please visit https://www.ontario.ca/page/handling-excess-soil.

- The report should reference that activities involving the management of excess soil should be completed in accordance with O. Reg. 406/19 and the MECP's current guidance document titled "Management of Excess Soil A Guide for Best Management Practices" (2014).
- All waste generated during construction must be disposed of in accordance with ministry requirements

□ Contaminated Sites

- Any current or historical waste disposal sites should be identified in the report. The status of these
 sites should be determined to confirm whether approval pursuant to Section 46 of the EPA may be
 required for land uses on former disposal sites. We recommend referring to the MECP's D-4 guideline
 for land use considerations near landfills and dumps.
 - Resources available may include regional/local municipal official plans and data; provincial data on large landfill sites and small landfill sites; Environmental Compliance Approval information for waste disposal sites on Access Environment.
- Other known contaminated sites (local, provincial, federal) in the study area should also be identified
 in the report (Note information on federal contaminated sites is found on the Government of
 Canada's website).
- The location of any underground storage tanks should be investigated in the report. Measures should
 be identified to ensure the integrity of these tanks and to ensure an appropriate response in the event
 of a spill. The ministry's Spills Action Centre must be contacted in such an event.
- Since the removal or movement of soils may be required, appropriate tests to determine contaminant levels from previous land uses or dumping should be undertaken. If the soils are contaminated, you must determine how and where they are to be disposed of, consistent with *Part XV.1 of the Environmental Protection Act* (EPA) and Ontario Regulation 153/04, Records of Site Condition, which details the new requirements related to site assessment and clean up. Please contact the appropriate MECP District Office for further consultation if contaminated sites are present.

□ Servicing, Utilities and Facilities

- The report should identify any above or underground utilities in the study area such as transmission lines, telephone/internet, oil/gas etc. The owners should be consulted to discuss impacts to this infrastructure, including potential spills.
- The report should identify any servicing infrastructure in the study area such as wastewater, water, stormwater that may potentially be impacted by the project.
- Any facility that releases emissions to the atmosphere, discharges contaminants to ground or surface
 water, provides potable water supplies, or stores, transports or disposes of waste must have an
 Environmental Compliance Approval (ECA) before it can operate lawfully. Please consult with
 MECP's Environmental Permissions Branch to determine whether a new or amended ECA will be
 required for any proposed infrastructure.
- We recommend referring to the ministry's <u>environmental land use planning guides</u> to ensure that any
 potential land use conflicts are considered when planning for any infrastructure or facilities related to
 wastewater, pipelines, landfills or industrial uses.

Mitigation ai	nd Monitoring	
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- Contractors must be made aware of all environmental considerations so that all environmental standards and commitments for both construction and operation are met. Mitigation measures should be clearly referenced in the report and regularly monitored during the construction stage of the project. In addition, we encourage proponents to conduct post-construction monitoring to ensure all mitigation measures have been effective and are functioning properly.
- Design and construction reports and plans should be based on a best management approach that
 centres on the prevention of impacts, protection of the existing environment, and opportunities for
 rehabilitation and enhancement of any impacted areas.
- The proponent's construction and post-construction monitoring plans must be documented in the report, as outlined in Section A.2.5 and A.4.1 of the MEA Class EA parent document.

Consultation

- The report must demonstrate how the consultation provisions of the Class EA have been fulfilled, including documentation of all stakeholder consultation efforts undertaken during the planning process. This includes a discussion in the report that identifies concerns that were raised and describes how they have been addressed by the proponent throughout the planning process. The report should also include copies of comments submitted on the project by interested stakeholders, and the proponent's responses to these comments (as directed by the Class EA to include full documentation).
- Please include the full stakeholder distribution/consultation list in the documentation.

□ Class EA Process

- If this project is a Master Plan: there are several different approaches that can be used to conduct a Master Plan, examples of which are outlined in Appendix 4 of the Class EA. The Master Plan should clearly indicate the selected approach for conducting the plan, by identifying whether the levels of assessment, consultation and documentation are sufficient to fulfill the requirements for Schedule B or C projects. Please note that any Schedule B or C projects identified in the plan would be subject to Part II Order Requests under the Environmental Assessment Act, although the plan itself would not be. Please include a description of the approach being undertaken (use Appendix 4 as a reference).
- If this project is a Master Plan: Any identified projects should also include information on the MCEA schedule associated with the project.
- The report should provide clear and complete documentation of the planning process in order to allow for transparency in decision-making.
- The Class EA requires the consideration of the effects of each alternative on all aspects of the environment (including planning, natural, social, cultural, economic, technical). The report should include a level of detail (e.g. hydrogeological investigations, terrestrial and aquatic assessments, cultural heritage assessments) such that all potential impacts can be identified, and appropriate mitigation measures can be developed. Any supporting studies conducted during the Class EA process should be referenced and included as part of the report.
- Please include in the report a list of all subsequent permits or approvals that may be required for the
 implementation of the preferred alternative, including but not limited to, MECP's PTTW, EASR
 Registrations and ECAs, conservation authority permits, species at risk permits, MTO permits and
 approvals under the *Impact Assessment Act*, 2019.

 all the available guides and to reference any relevant information in the report.

Amendments to the EAA through the Covid-19 Economic Recovery Act, 2020

Once the EA Report is finalized, the proponent must issue a Notice of Completion providing a minimum 30-day period during which documentation may be reviewed and comment and input can be submitted to the proponent. The Notice of Completion must be sent to the appropriate MECP Regional Office email address (for projects in MECP Southwest Region, the email is eanotification.swregion@ontario.ca).

The public has the ability to request a higher level of assessment on a project if they are concerned about potential adverse impacts to constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. In addition, the Minister may issue an order on his or her own initiative within a specified time period. The Director (of the Environmental Assessment Branch) will issue a Notice of Proposed Order to the proponent if the Minister is considering an order for the project within 30 days after the conclusion of the comment period on the Notice of Completion. At this time, the Director may request additional information from the proponent. Once the requested information has been received, the Minister will have 30 days within which to make a decision or impose conditions on your project.

Therefore, the proponent cannot proceed with the project until at least 30 days after the end of the comment period provided for in the Notice of Completion. Further, the proponent may not proceed after this time if:

- a Part II Order request has been submitted to the ministry regarding potential adverse impacts to constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights, or
- the Director has issued a Notice of Proposed order regarding the project.

Please ensure that the Notice of Completion advises that outstanding concerns are to be directed to the proponent for a response, and that in the event there are outstanding concerns regarding potential adverse impacts to constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights, Part II Order requests on those matters should be addressed in writing to:

A PROPONENT'S INTRODUCTION TO THE DELEGATION OF PROCEDURAL ASPECTS OF CONSULTATION WITH ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES

DEFINITIONS

The following definitions are specific to this document and may not apply in other contexts:

Aboriginal communities – the First Nation or Métis communities identified by the Crown for the purpose of consultation.

Consultation – the Crown's legal obligation to consult when the Crown has knowledge of an established or asserted Aboriginal or treaty right and contemplates conduct that might adversely impact that right. This is the type of consultation required pursuant to s. 35 of the *Constitution Act*, 1982. Note that this definition does not include consultation with Aboriginal communities for other reasons, such as regulatory requirements.

Crown - the Ontario Crown, acting through a particular ministry or ministries.

Procedural aspects of consultation – those portions of consultation related to the process of consultation, such as notifying an Aboriginal community about a project, providing information about the potential impacts of a project, responding to concerns raised by an Aboriginal community and proposing changes to the project to avoid negative impacts.

Proponent – the person or entity that wants to undertake a project and requires an Ontario Crown decision or approval for the project.

I. PURPOSE

The Crown has a legal duty to consult Aboriginal communities when it has knowledge of an existing or asserted Aboriginal or treaty right and contemplates conduct that may adversely impact that right. In outlining a framework for the duty to consult, the Supreme Court of Canada has stated that the Crown may delegate procedural aspects of consultation to third parties. This document provides general information about the Ontario Crown's approach to delegation of the procedural aspects of consultation to proponents.

This document is not intended to instruct a proponent about an individual project, and it does not constitute legal advice.

II. WHY IS IT NECESSARY TO CONSULT WITH ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES?

The objective of the modern law of Aboriginal and treaty rights is the *reconciliation* of Aboriginal peoples and non-Aboriginal peoples and their respective rights, claims and interests. Consultation is an important component of the reconciliation process.

The Crown has a legal duty to consult Aboriginal communities when it has knowledge of an existing or asserted Aboriginal or treaty right and contemplates conduct that might adversely impact that right. For example, the Crown's duty to consult is triggered when it considers issuing a permit, authorization or approval for a project which has the potential to adversely impact an Aboriginal right, such as the right to hunt, fish, or trap in a particular area.

The scope of consultation required in particular circumstances ranges across a spectrum depending on both the nature of the asserted or established right and the seriousness of the potential adverse impacts on that right.

Depending on the particular circumstances, the Crown may also need to take steps to accommodate the potentially impacted Aboriginal or treaty right. For example, the Crown may be required to avoid or minimize the potential adverse impacts of the project.

III. THE CROWN'S ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES IN THE DELEGATED CONSULTATION PROCESS

The Crown has the responsibility for ensuring that the duty to consult, and accommodate where appropriate, is met. However, the Crown may delegate the procedural aspects of consultation to a proponent.

There are different ways in which the Crown may delegate the procedural aspects of consultation to a proponent, including through a letter, a memorandum of understanding, legislation, regulation, policy and codes of practice.

If the Crown decides to delegate procedural aspects of consultation, the Crown will generally:

- Ensure that the delegation of procedural aspects of consultation and the responsibilities of the proponent are clearly communicated to the proponent;
- Identify which Aboriginal communities must be consulted;
- Provide contact information for the Aboriginal communities;
- Revise, as necessary, the list of Aboriginal communities to be consulted as new information becomes available and is assessed by the Crown;
- Assess the scope of consultation owed to the Aboriginal communities;
- Maintain appropriate oversight of the actions taken by the proponent in fulfilling the procedural aspects of consultation;
- Assess the adequacy of consultation that is undertaken and any accommodation that may be required;
- Provide a contact within any responsible ministry in case issues arise that require direction from the Crown; and
- Participate in the consultation process as necessary and as determined by the Crown.

IV. THE PROPONENT'S ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES IN THE DELEGATED CONSULTATION PROCESS

Where aspects of the consultation process have been delegated to a proponent, the Crown, in meeting its duty to consult, will rely on the proponent's consultation activities and documentation of those activities. The consultation process informs the Crown's decision of whether or not to approve a proposed project or activity.

A proponent's role and responsibilities will vary depending on a variety of factors including the extent of consultation required in the circumstance and the procedural aspects of consultation the Crown has delegated to it. Proponents are often in a better position than the Crown to discuss a project and its potential impacts with Aboriginal communities and to determine ways to avoid or minimize the adverse impacts of a project.

A proponent can raise issues or questions with the Crown at any time during the consultation process. If issues or concerns arise during the consultation that cannot be addressed by the proponent, the proponent should contact the Crown.

a) What might a proponent be required to do in carrying out the procedural aspects of consultation?

Where the Crown delegates procedural aspects of consultation, it is often the proponent's responsibility to provide notice of the proposed project to the identified Aboriginal communities. The notice should indicate that the Crown has delegated the procedural aspects of consultation to the proponent and should include the following information:

- a description of the proposed project or activity;
- mapping;
- proposed timelines;
- details regarding anticipated environmental and other impacts;
- details regarding opportunities to comment; and
- any changes to the proposed project that have been made for seasonal conditions or other factors, where relevant.

Proponents should provide enough information and time to allow Aboriginal communities to provide meaningful feedback regarding the potential impacts of the project. Depending on the nature of consultation required for a project, a proponent also may be required to:

- provide the Crown with copies of any consultation plans prepared and an opportunity to review and comment;
- ensure that any necessary follow-up discussions with Aboriginal communities take place in a timely manner, including to confirm receipt of information, share and update information and to address questions or concerns that may arise;
- as appropriate, discuss with Aboriginal communities potential mitigation measures and/or changes to the project in response to concerns raised by Aboriginal communities;
- use language that is accessible and not overly technical, and translate material into Aboriginal languages where requested or appropriate;
- bear the reasonable costs associated with the consultation process such as, but not limited to, meeting hall rental, meal costs, document translation(s), or to address technical & capacity issues;
- provide the Crown with all the details about potential impacts on established or asserted Aboriginal or treaty rights, how these concerns have been considered and addressed by the proponent and the Aboriginal communities and any steps taken to mitigate the potential impacts;
- provide the Crown with complete and accurate documentation from these meetings and communications; and
- notify the Crown immediately if an Aboriginal community not identified by the Crown approaches the proponent seeking consultation opportunities.

b) What documentation and reporting does the Crown need from the proponent?

Proponents should keep records of all communications with the Aboriginal communities involved in the consultation process and any information provided to these Aboriginal communities.

As the Crown is required to assess the adequacy of consultation, it needs documentation to satisfy itself that the proponent has fulfilled the procedural aspects of consultation delegated to it. The documentation required would typically include:

- the date of meetings, the agendas, any materials distributed, those in attendance and copies
 of any minutes prepared;
- the description of the proposed project that was shared at the meeting;
- any and all concerns or other feedback provided by the communities;
- any information that was shared by a community in relation to its asserted or established Aboriginal or treaty rights and any potential adverse impacts of the proposed activity, approval or disposition on such rights;
- any proposed project changes or mitigation measures that were discussed, and feedback from Aboriginal communities about the proposed changes and measures;
- any commitments made by the proponent in response to any concerns raised, and feedback from Aboriginal communities on those commitments;
- copies of correspondence to or from Aboriginal communities, and any materials distributed electronically or by mail;
- information regarding any financial assistance provided by the proponent to enable participation by Aboriginal communities in the consultation;
- periodic consultation progress reports or copies of meeting notes if requested by the Crown;
- a summary of how the delegated aspects of consultation were carried out and the results; and
- a summary of issues raised by the Aboriginal communities, how the issues were addressed and any outstanding issues.

In certain circumstances, the Crown may share and discuss the proponent's consultation record with an Aboriginal community to ensure that it is an accurate reflection of the consultation process.

c) Will the Crown require a proponent to provide information about its commercial arrangements with Aboriginal communities?

The Crown may require a proponent to share information about aspects of commercial arrangements between the proponent and Aboriginal communities where the arrangements:

- include elements that are directed at mitigating or otherwise addressing impacts of the project:
- include securing an Aboriginal community's support for the project; or
- may potentially affect the obligations of the Crown to the Aboriginal communities.

The proponent should make every reasonable effort to exempt the Crown from confidentiality provisions in commercial arrangements with Aboriginal communities to the extent necessary to allow this information to be shared with the Crown.

The Crown cannot guarantee that information shared with the Crown will remain confidential. Confidential commercial information should not be provided to the Crown as part of the consultation record if it is not relevant to the duty to consult or otherwise required to be submitted to the Crown as part of the regulatory process.

V. WHAT ARE THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF ABORIGINAL COMMUNITIES' IN THE CONSULTATION PROCESS?

Like the Crown, Aboriginal communities are expected to engage in consultation in good faith. This includes:

- responding to the consultation notice;
- engaging in the proposed consultation process;
- providing relevant documentation;
- clearly articulating the potential impacts of the proposed project on Aboriginal or treaty rights;
 and
- discussing ways to mitigates any adverse impacts.

Some Aboriginal communities have developed tools, such as consultation protocols, policies or processes that provide guidance on how they would prefer to be consulted. Although not legally binding, proponents are encouraged to respect these community processes where it is reasonable to do so. Please note that there is no obligation for a proponent to pay a fee to an Aboriginal community in order to enter into a consultation process.

To ensure that the Crown is aware of existing community consultation protocols, proponents should contact the relevant Crown ministry when presented with a consultation protocol by an Aboriginal community or anyone purporting to be a representative of an Aboriginal community.

VI. WHAT IF MORE THAN ONE PROVINCIAL CROWN MINISTRY IS INVOLVED IN APPROVING A PROPONENT'S PROJECT?

Depending on the project and the required permits or approvals, one or more ministries may delegate procedural aspects of the Crown's duty to consult to the proponent. The proponent may contact individual ministries for guidance related to the delegation of procedural aspects of consultation for ministry-specific permits/approvals required for the project in question. Proponents are encouraged to seek input from all involved Crown ministries sooner rather than later.

Hello Zachary,

I apologize for the delayed response. MECP is continuing to work through a back-log of requests.

Species at Risk Branch (SARB) has conducted a review of the subject property located at Regional Road 14 (Thirty Road) at Young Street, in the Township of West Lincoln.

The following additional species are within the vicinity of the site and are not listed in the submission:

- Bank Swallow
- Barn Swallow
- Butternut
- Chimney Swift
- Lilliput
- Mapleleaf Mussel
- White Wood Aster

A review of the Provincial database of species occurrences notes that the protected habitat of species at risk bats may also occur within the project site. Additional work may be required to confirm the presence of this habitat and other species at risk habitat which cannot be readily identified via this preliminary screening. More information on how each species protected habitat is defined can be found on our website here: www.ontario.ca/page/species-risk.

While this review represents MECP's best currently available information, it is important to note that a lack of information for a location does not mean that SAR or their habitat are not present. There are

many areas where the Government of Ontario does not currently have information, especially in areas not previously surveyed. On-site assessments will need to be conducted to better verify site conditions, identify and confirm presence of SAR and/or their habitats.

Should vegetation removal be required as part of the proposed project, MECP recommends that a qualified biologist with botany expertise be retained to survey for SAR plants and to conduct habitat studies for the remaining species.

It is the responsibility of the proponent and their consultant to ensure that SAR are not killed, harmed, or harassed, and that their habitat is not damaged or destroyed through the undertaking of the proposed activities to be carried out on the site. If the proposed activities can not avoid impacting protected species and/or their habitats, then the proponent will need to apply for an authorization under the Endangered Species Act, 2007.

Project Review Unit Comments - Environmental Study Report

Thank you for providing the ministry with an opportunity to comment on the draft Environmental Study Report (the Report) for the above noted Class Environmental Assessment (EA) project. Our understanding is that in order to address road safety requirements, assess the existing road capacity and future travel demand, Niagara Region (the proponent) has determined that the preferred alternative is to close Clayson Road at the northern terminus with traffic directed to the improved Thirty Road and Young Street intersection. The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (ministry) provides the following comments for your consideration.

General

- 1) On page 50, Section 6.2.1.1. Public Information Centre #1, an error message is displayed in the final paragraph. This should be corrected in the final ESR.
- 2) On page 60, Table 6.6 Consultation with Impacted Property Owners has the last row left blank. Please correct this in the final ESR.
- 3) Table 6.8 of the Consultation Log of Communications with Indigenous Communities shows that communities did not respond to the notifications sent. Please provide how the notices

- were sent to the communities. Please also ensure that meeting minutes are included in the records if meetings are undertaken.
- 4) On page ES 5 of the Report, Table ES 1 is missing a dollar sign before the cost of Roads. Please correct this in the final Report.
- 5) The proponent may wish to add a Conclusion section to the Report that includes a short summary listing key activities and the principal decisions/conclusions.

Class EA Process & Master Plan Approach

- 6) In Section 8.5.1.1 of the Report, it indicates that after discussions with Hydro One, conceptual plans of the recommended design concept will be reviewed subsequent to this Class EA process, during the detailed design phase. Please note that if the outcome results in a significant modification to the project, including impacting the evaluation of alternative solutions or the preferred solution, then a Class EA addendum may be required through the Municipal Class EA process.
- 7) Please note that the 2024 version of the MECA has been released as in the Report (Section 1.5) lists the 2023 amendment of the MECA as the latest update. More information is available here: Municipal Class EA.pdf and here: Notice of amendment Municipal Class EA.pdf

Indigenous Consultation

- 8) The proponent should continue to engage with all communities that have been engaged with to date as the Class EA process proceeds.
- 9) The Report indicates that a Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment will be completed early in the detailed design phase of the project. The proponent should continue to engage with all communities that have been engaged with to date as the Class EA process proceeds. Furthermore, the proponent should ensure that communities are aware of this ongoing Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment and provided the opportunity to participate in that process if possible.
- 10) Please continue reaching out to communities if there are any substantial changes to the project/process or if the proponent is applying for subsequent permits from the ministry that may be of interest or concern to communities. We recommend that the proponent include the record of consultation with any subsequent applications to the ministry to help in our review of those applications.

Air Quality and Odour

11) The ministry expects the report to include at a minimum a qualitative assessment of air quality and odour that discusses the typical air emissions that are released from the proposed undertaking and summarizes the closest sensitive receptors to the existing and proposed pumping station and how the proposed undertaking may impact air quality. The proposed odour mitigation measures and consideration of a monitoring program to be developed should also be discussed in this air quality section.

Excess Materials and Waste

12) All waste generated during construction must be disposed of in accordance with ministry requirements.

Source Water Protection

13) While most source protection plans focus on including policies for significant drinking water threats in the WHPAs and IPZs it should be noted that even though source protection plan policies may not apply in HVAs, these are areas where aquifers are sensitive and at risk to impacts and within these areas, activities may impact the quality of sources of drinking water for systems other than municipal residential systems.

Species at Risk

14) Section 2.3.3 of the Report indicates bat maternity roosting habitats (treed communities) have the potential to be present within the study area. If Species at Risk are observed, it is the responsibility of the proponent to ensure that Species at Risk are not killed, harmed, or harassed, and that their habitat is not damaged or destroyed through the proposed activities to be carried out on the site. If the proposed activities cannot avoid impacting protected species and their habitats, then the proponent will need to apply for an authorization under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). If the proponent believes that their proposed activities are going to have an impact or are uncertain about the impacts, they should contact SAROntario@ontario.ca to undergo a formal review under the ESA.

Approvals

15) Section 8.2.4 of the Report states, "The rate of infiltration should be sufficiently low that groundwater should be adequately controlled using conventional construction 'dewatering' techniques such as pumping from sumps and ditches." Please note that any potential approval requirements should be identified in the report. Please note that any water extraction over 50,000 L/day will require MECP approval(s) under the Environmental Protection Act and Ontario Water Resource Act, such as a Permit to Take Water (PTTW). Certain water taking activities that have been prescribed by the Water Taking Regulation O. Reg. 63/16 may require registration in the Environmental Activity and Sector Registry (EASR) instead of a PTTW. Regardless, a PTTW is required if the water-taking exceeds 400,000 litres per day. More information regarding PTTW and EASR is accessible online at these links: Water taking and transfer user guide: clarifications and exemptions | ontario.ca and Water taking user guide for Environmental Activity and Sector Registry | ontario.ca.

Thank you for providing) us with the Notice of Commencement for the above-referenced project.

Please note that the responsibility for administration of the *Ontario Heritage Act* and matters related to cultural heritage recently transferred from the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport (MTCS) to the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM). Individual staff roles and contact information remain unchanged. Please continue to send any notices, report and/or documentation to both Karla Barboza and myself.

MCM's interest in this Environmental Assessment (EA) project relates to its mandate of conserving Ontario's cultural heritage, which includes:

- archaeological resources, including land and marine;
- built heritage resources, including bridges and monuments; and
- cultural heritage landscapes.

Under the EA process, the proponent is required to determine a project's potential impact on known (previously recognized) and potential cultural heritage resources.

Project Summary

Niagara Region has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study (EA) for potential realignment and intersection improvements of Regional Road 14 (Thirty Road) at Young Street in the Township of West Lincoln. The project is being completed as a Schedule "C" project in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, amended in 2007, 2011 & 2015), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Identifying Cultural Heritage Resources

While some cultural heritage resources may have already been formally identified, others may be identified through screening and evaluation.

Archaeological Resources

This EA project may impact archaeological resources and should be screened using the Ministry <u>Criteria for Evaluating Archaeological Potential</u> to determine if an archaeological assessment is needed. MCM archaeological sites data are available at <u>archaeology@ontario.ca</u>.

If the EA project area exhibits archaeological potential, then an archaeological assessment (AA) shall be undertaken by an archaeologist licenced under the *Ontario Heritage Act (OHA)*, who is responsible for submitting the report directly to MCM for review.

Built Heritage Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes

A Cultural Heritage Report: Existing Conditions and Preliminary Impact Assessment will be undertaken for the entire study area during the planning phase and will be summarized in the EA Report. This study will:

- Describe the existing baseline cultural heritage conditions within the study area by identifying all known or potential built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes, including a historical summary of the study area. The Ministry has developed screening criteria that may assist with this exercise: <u>Criteria for Evaluating for Potential Built Heritage</u> <u>Resources and Cultural Heritage Landscapes</u>.
- 2. <u>Identify preliminary potential project-specific impacts</u> on the known and potential built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes that have been identified. The report should include a description of the anticipated impact to each known or potential built heritage resource or cultural heritage landscape that has been identified.
- 3. Recommend measures to avoid or mitigate potential negative impacts to known or potential built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes. The proposed mitigation measures are to inform the next steps of project planning and design.

Given that this project covers a large study area, MCM recommends that the Cultural Heritage Report is carried out so that step 1 described above is undertaken early in the planning process. Then, steps 2 and 3 can be undertaken once the preferred alternatives have been selected.

Cultural Heritage Reports will be undertaken by a qualified person who has expertise, recent experience, and knowledge relevant to the type of cultural heritage resources being considered and the nature of the activity being proposed.

Community input should be sought to identify locally recognized and potential cultural heritage resources. Sources include, but are not limited to, municipal heritage committees, historical societies and other local heritage organizations.

Cultural heritage resources are often of critical importance to Indigenous communities. Indigenous communities may have knowledge that can contribute to the identification of cultural heritage resources, and we suggest that any engagement with Indigenous communities includes a discussion about known or potential cultural heritage resources that are of value to them.

Environmental Assessment Reporting

All technical cultural heritage studies and their recommendations are to be addressed and incorporated into EA projects. Please advise MCM whether any technical cultural heritage studies will be completed for this EA project, and provide them to MCM before issuing a Notice of Completion or commencing any work on the site. If screening has identified no known or potential cultural heritage resources, or no impacts to these resources, please include the completed checklists and supporting documentation in the EA report or file.

Thank you for contacting the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism (MCM) regarding the above-referenced project.

MCM's interest in this project relates to its mandate of conserving Ontario's cultural heritage, which includes:

- archaeological resources, including land and marine);
- built heritage resources, including bridges and monuments; and
- cultural heritage landscapes.

We have reviewed the Draft Environmental Study Report (ESR) dated July 10, 2024, prepared by R.V. Anderson Associates Ltd., including the Cultural Heritage Assessment Report: Built Heritage and Cultural Landscape Assessment (CHAR) dated April 25, 2024, prepared by Parslow Heritage Consultancy Inc. and provided in Appendix 4 to the Draft ESR, and offer the following comments.

Project Summary

Niagara Region has initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study (EA) for potential realignment and intersection improvements of Regional Road 14 (Thirty Road) at Young Street in the Township of West Lincoln. The project is being completed as a Schedule

"C" project in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, amended in 2007, 2011 & 2015), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Comments: CHAR

- 1. The title of the report includes "Built Heritage and Cultural Landscape Assessment", which may be intended to reference built heritage resources and cultural heritage landscapes, but is worded confusingly and does not reference defined terms. More broadly however, a report of this type that screens the study area for properties with potential cultural heritage value or interest (CHVI) and recommends individual study for those with such potential is normally titled a Cultural Heritage Report: Existing Conditions and Preliminary Impact Assessment, and the appropriateness of this title should be considered.
- 2. The Project Context section lists, as one of the tasks undertaken, "Evaluation of potential heritage resources against the criteria set forth by Ontario Regulation (O. Reg.) 9/06". The document does not, however, appear to include an evaluation against the O. Reg. 9/06 criteria; instead, the recommendations include that properties identified as having potential CHVI be subjected to property specific CHERs to identify whether they are of CHVI. These CHERs would presumably include an evaluation against the O. Reg. 9/06 criteria. The noted statement should be removed or clarified.
- 3. In Table 2, the "Description of Known or Potential CHVI" should make some suggestion as to which of the O. Reg 9/06 criteria the property has potential to meet.

Comments: Draft ESR

- 1. Section 2.4.1 should note explicitly that the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment found significant portions of the study area to be of archaeological potential, and recommended Stage 2 assessment for those areas if included in the preferred alternative.
- 2. Section 4.1.4 introduces the criterion "Impacts to Areas of Archeological Potential: Potential to impact archaeological resources within the study area." This creates confusion as to whether it is impacts to areas of archaeological potential or to archaeological resources that is being measured in this criterion. Given that at this point in the process only areas of archaeological potential have been identified (through the Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment) and any archaeological resources in those areas would only be identified during the Detailed Design stage, it would seem that impacts to areas of archaeological potential is the only plausible criterion to be used here. We recommend revising the description of the criterion to better reflect its intent.
- 3. Section 4.1.4 also introduces the criterion "Impacts to Cultural Heritage Resources: Potential impacts to the built cultural heritage resources within and adjacent to the corridor, in consideration of their determined cultural heritage values." It is unclear what the last clause of this sentence is intended to mean, given that the cultural heritage value or interest of the potential built heritage resources in the study area will only be determined through a CHER during detailed design. We recommend that the words "in consideration of their determined cultural heritage values" be removed.
- 4. Section 8..4.1 says that "Based on the preliminary Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment, it is determined that archaeological potential exists for parts of the study area and therefore the study area retains cultural heritage value or interest." Having archaeological potential does not by itself constitute CHVI; CHVI would be assessed during a Stage 3 Archaeological Assessment for any archaeological sites identified at Stage 2. We recommend that the words from "and therefore" to the end of the sentence be removed. The word "preliminary" can also

be removed, as the Stage 1 report has been duly submitted and entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports.

5. Table 10.1 includes two rows related to MCM, namely "Further Archaeological Assessments" and "Discovery of Human Remains". However, the Description field for the first of these pertains to the discovery of archaeological resources during construction. We recommend that these two Descriptions be merged into a row titled "Discovery of Archaeological Resources During Construction", and that a new description be written for "Further Archaeological Assessments". This description should note the requirements for further archaeological assessments described in the third bullet under "Technical Studies" in Section 10.2, and in particular that notification from MCM that the archaeological assessment reports have been entered into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports will be received before construction. We further suggest that Section and Table 10.1 be renamed "Permits, Approvals and Legislative Requirements", since requirements under the Ontario Heritage Act are not permits or approvals per se.

In situations where human remains are associated with archaeological resources, the Ministry of Citizenship and Multiculturalism should also be notified (at archaeology@ontario.ca) to ensure that the archaeological site is not subject to unlicensed alterations which would be a contravention of the Ontario Heritage Act.



Thank you for providing comments regarding our design. Based on a floodplain elevation of 192.52m we have determined that there would only about 31.5m3 of fill within the floodplain area. As such, it appears that no further study is required.

Please confirm the requirements with regards to quality and quantity control for stormwater runoff. There will be an increase in impermeable area, so peak flows are anticipated to increase accordingly. In order to accommodate this increase, we can implement a SWM pond on the Region's ROW between the maintenance facility and the realigned north leg of the intersection. This should be sufficient to provide quantity control and some quality control. Will the NPCA require any additional measures for quality control (i.e. OGS's?).

- 1. The regulated flood elevation in this area is 192.52, and there appears to be work proposed in the floodplain which will require a NPCA permit.
- 2. NPCA permits up to 50m3 of fill in the floodplain without further studies. Should a volume of fill larger than 50m3 be proposed, NPCA will require a balanced cut/ fill or hydraulic assessment to demonstrate no negative impacts.

Thank you for providing comments regarding our design. Based on a floodplain elevation of 192.52m we have determined that there would only about 31.5m3 of fill within the floodplain area. As such, it appears that no further study is required.

Please confirm the requirements with regards to quality and quantity control for stormwater runoff. There will be an increase in impermeable area, so peak flows are anticipated to increase accordingly. In order to accommodate this increase, we can implement a SWM pond on the Region's ROW between the maintenance facility and the realigned north leg of the intersection. This should be sufficient to provide quantity control and some quality control. Will the NPCA require any additional measures for quality control (i.e. OGS's?).

- 1. The regulated flood elevation in this area is 192.52, and there appears to be work proposed in the floodplain which will require a NPCA permit.
- 2. NPCA permits up to 50m3 of fill in the floodplain without further studies. Should a volume of fill larger than 50m3 be proposed, NPCA will require a balanced cut/ fill or hydraulic assessment to demonstrate no negative impacts.

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Hi Andrew

The risk with roundabouts is that they are a form of an intersection where cars slow down considerably and even stop. There are also additional facilities such as pedestrian crosswalks on the periphery of the roundabout. This would result in cars or pedestrians being stopped underneath the transmission line for prolonged periods of time vs a regular road where cars and pedestrians cross quickly. Such an arrangement increases the risk profile for the road users from objects falling from the transmission line – most notable is ice in the winter, however it could be components of the towers or the conductors.

So for those reasons we want to mitigate the risk by pushing such infrastructure outside of our rights of way.

Thanks for the timely response. Some additional clarification on your email below would be very helpful... as the roundabout option would best address the existing safety issue, satisfy traffic operations and reduce impacts to the adjacent landowners:

1. The attached correspondence from Hydro One notes that "...we have confirmed that Hydro One has existing high voltage Transmission facilities within your study area". Does that not refer to the large Towers running along the north side of Thirty Rd and Young St (identified in the Pics below)? No, we were referring to the vacant transmission corridor.



2. Re "The options which introduce roundabouts within our corridor lands may be more problematic and we would advise against those". Could you please elaborate on what you mean by problematic? le. Is this a hard "No"? the roundabouts may need to be pushed up (north I believe) so that they are outside the corridor footprint, however the roads connecting to them can be cross the corridor. The reason for that we have to ensure that we can build a line safely when the need for it arises. Transmission lines going directly on top of a roundabout is usually a concern as it may not be safe for the road users.

Appreciate your prompt attention to this as it could have a significant impact on our proposed solution for the intersection.

On behalf of the project team, thank you for providing the information regarding existing Hydro One high voltage transmission facilities along the north side of Young Street and either side of Thirty Road, as well as the transmission corridor / Hydro One ROW located along the south of Young Street within the study area.

Please find attached a file highlighting the conceptual design alternatives we are currently considering. For ease of use, we have indicated all utility poles in Blue (local poles small blue dots, hydro One poll large blue dots), and all property lines in Green. Please note that these design alternatives are still conceptual in nature and may change prior to the PIC (March 9th), and that impacts identified may change as the study progresses and the design is refined. These alternatives were discussed Wednesday, at our Technical Agency Committee Meeting, however, Hydro One was unable to attend.

Currently the preliminary recommendation is to carry forward design concepts 2 and 3, which may result in impacts to ten existing local utility poles (small blue dots) on Young Street and Thirty Road and some impacts to Hydro One land to the south of the corridor as shown in the attached. Additionally, this would result in the road encroaching toward the transmission poles currently located within the Region's ROW and Region's property located on NE corner (Picture 1 below). Based on our understanding, we do not believe this would require any relocation of the poles, however, it is understood guard rail would need to be installed, similar to the current arrangement along Thirty Road.

SECONDARY LAND USE PROPOSAL SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS IN AND AROUND HYDRO ONE TRANSMISSION CORRIDORS

Hydro One strives to work with proponents to review secondary land use proposals on the ROWs to ensure they are compatible with the safety and maintenance requirements of its high-voltage equipment. The Hydro One transmission network can consist of steel lattice towers, monopoles, twin wood poles, overhead conductors and underground cable ducts. Our transmission lines conduct electricity at 115kV, 230kV or 500kV.

Technical reviews for each proposal must be completed by Hydro One. These reviews may require several weeks or months to complete depending on the complexity of the proposal. For a typical proposal, our turnaround time is about 8 to 10 weeks. Resubmissions may require the same timelines. Hydro One technical reviews must be approved and occupation agreements in place prior to any construction work. Detailed drawings that need to be submitted include: site plan, grading, drainage, lighting, landscaping, signage (including any other above grade structures) and profiles for underground works. Additional drawings may be requested but please do not send them to us unless we have asked for them. A non-refundable Engineering Review Fee (ERF) is required prior to circulation of technical review. This fee is collected at the time of your official submission.

To effectively review and provide comments, your proposal must include the following information:

- <u>LAND/EASEMENT PROPERTY LINES</u>: On the site plans indicate and label property lines of the Hydro One right-of-way in RED. Label the ROW as Hydro One Transmission (not Open Space).
- <u>HYDRO ONE STRUCTURES</u>: Illustrate and label all Hydro One structures and the overhead centreline of the towers. The Real Estate Coordinator can provide Hydro One structure numbers.
- <u>GRADES and DRAINAGE</u>: Indicate existing and proposed grades. Grading changes must not result in standing water anywhere along the corridor, and especially not within 15 metre radial zone of transmission structures.
- <u>MAINTENANCE ACCESS ROUTE</u>: Indicate and label a 6 metre wide Hydro One maintenance access route to each Hydro One structure.
- MAINTENANCE ZONE and CONSTRUCTION EXCLUSION ZONE: Indicate and label a 15 metre radial maintenance work zone and a 10.0 metre radial construction exclusion zone around each Hydro One structure measured from the tower footings.
 If any proposed infrastructure is contemplated within this 15 metre zone, the distance from the edge of the proposed infrastructure to the edge of the nearest tower footing must be shown.
- <u>LIGHTING</u>: Keep lighting as far away from our circuits as possible, toward the outer edge of the corridor. The locations and the height of each light post must be clearly illustrated and described.
- <u>LANDSCAPING</u>: Plantings which grow to a maturity height over 3 metres are not permitted on the ROW. Hydro One has a *Compatible Species List* which can be provided.
- <u>RESUBMITTED DRAWINGS</u>: If a resubmission of drawings is required, the revised drawings must include "bubbles" over the areas where changes were made to help us identify the areas that need to be reviewed.

TECHNICAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR SECONDARY LAND USE PROPOSALS ON HYDRO ONE TRANSMISSION CORRIDORS

Your project may involve proposed works on Hydro One electrical transmission corridors or rights-of-way (ROW). Hydro One will work with proponents to review secondary land use proposals on the ROWs to ensure that they are compatible with the safety and maintenance requirements of its high-voltage equipment. The Hydro One transmission network can consist of steel lattice towers, monopoles, twin wood poles, overhead and underground conductors, etc.

When preparing a proposal, there are a number of technical considerations that should be kept in mind. A number of these are outlined below. Please note that this is not intended to be a comprehensive list of requirements, but aims to serves as a guideline to prepare a proposal. Reviews for each proposal are conducted individually by Hydro One and may require several weeks or months to complete depending on the complexity of the proposal.

Technical Considerations:

Grading, Drainage and Stormwater Management

- Grading changes must not result in standing water anywhere along the corridor, and especially not within the 15 metre radial zone of transmission structures.
- No fill material may be placed on the ROW without written approval from Hydro One.
- o Catch basins that are not positioned within a paved roadway are not permitted.
- Stormwater management (SWM) ponds placed under 115 and 230 kV transmission lines cannot exceed two-thirds of the corridor width.
- o SWM ponds under 500 kV transmission lines cannot exceed one-third of the corridor width.
- SWM ponds must be designed to withstand the effects of 100-year storm conditions.

Roads and Parking

- o Roads crossing the ROW should be perpendicular to the hydro corridor.
- o Roads off ROW should stay 15 metre clear of transmission structures.
- Curb cuts or access gates should be provided for Hydro One maintenance vehicles.
- Parking facilities on 115 kV and 230 kV ROWs should be restricted to passenger vehicles only. Large truck and trailer parking is generally not permitted.
- o Parking facilities are generally not permitted under 500 kV ROWs.
- o Transmission towers near roads and parking areas must be protected by standard highway barriers.

Vertical Clearances

- Transmission conductors (wires) are dynamic in nature. They can sag lower to the ground depending on parameters such as ambient temperature and operating conditions.
- Minimum vertical clearances must be maintained from the maximum design sag levels of the conductors (worst-case scenario). Hydro One will review these clearances as they are case-specific and not immediately apparent by observation alone.

Access to Structures

- An unhindered, minimum 6-metre wide access path to facilities on the corridor must be provided for maintenance vehicles.
- A 15 metre clear working radius around transmission structures is required in order to maintain access for vehicles carrying out routine maintenance.
- o A 3 metre radius around each tower footing must be left unpaved for access to the footing.



Pipelines & Underground Facilities

- All underground facilities must be designed to withstand the loading conditions created by heavy maintenance vehicles that may be used by Hydro One.
- o The ROW must be restored to pre-construction condition once the project is completed.
- Excavation using heavy machinery is prohibited within 10 metres of tower footings to protect foundations. Within 10 metres, excavation must be carried out by hand or by use of a VAC system.
- Pipelines on ROWs must adhere to the provisions of CSA Standard C22.3 No. 6.

Landscape Plantings

On behalf of the Region of Niagara, please find within the Hydro One Secondary Land Use Technical Review package for the above-mentioned project, for Hydro One's review and comment. This package is submitted for preliminary technical review, as discussed in the coordination meeting with Hydro One, Region of Niagara, and R.V. Anderson Associates Ltd. staff on April 4, 2022, and does not represent a final secondary land use proposal.

As you know, RVA, on behalf of the Niagara Region, is undertaking a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study (EA) for intersection improvements and potential realignment of Regional Road 14 (Thirty Road) at Young Street in the Township of West Lincoln. The main objective of the study is to address the need for operational and safety improvements at the intersection. The Study Area extends approximately 600 meters in each direction as shown in the key plan below.

The area of Thirty Road at Young Street and Thirty Road at Clayson Road requires geometric improvements to address safety issues for all users due to:

- Reverse curve alignment of Thirty Road causing insufficient stopping sightline distance at Young Street and maneuverability issues for larger farm vehicles and commercial trucks
- Right-of-way conflict at Thirty Road and Clayson Road
- Westbound traffic utilizing Clayson Road as a cut-through to avoid Thirty Road at Young Street intersection
- Lack of pedestrian and cyclist facilities
- · Higher vehicle speeds.

As part of Phase 3 of the Class EA, the project team has developed several alternative design concepts to implement the Phase 2 EA preferred solution, including the introduction of a roundabout, signalized, and 4-way stop intersection control(s). While the project team has not completed the full evaluation of the alternative design concepts, based on a preliminary assessment, introduction of a roundabout configuration is preferred by the Region as it would address existing and future traffic operations and safety requirements; and significantly reduce impacts to the active farmland along the north side, which has been identified as Prime Agricultural and Floodplain/Environmental Protection Area. This option would also have reduced costs to implement in comparison to the other options, which would require significant realignment of Thirty Road north of the intersection.

Implementation of the design concepts under may result in impacts to the currently vacant *Infrastructure Ontario* corridor dedicated to potential future Hydro One infrastructure, as shown in the attached ALT 2 - INTERSECTION OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS ONLY (NO REALIGNMENT) drawing. These lands are required to accommodate both traffic operations (i.e travel lanes) and lighting requirements. It is noted that the actual impacts to Hydro One's transmission corridor boundaries, profile and cross-section of the intersection, and the proposed lighting and landscape plans would be confirmed during the detailed design phase of the study, following completion of the Class EA.





 Hydro One noted that if the need for future transmission lines are identified, vacant corridors allow for quicker schedules in comparison with obtaining lands. INFO

 Hydro One noted that roads usually cross corridors perpendicular, or at an angle, and that intersections are generally not located under Hydro One Infrastructure. It was noted that when Hydro One corridors are adjacent to roadways as is the case for the corridor along Young Street, intersections are located under Hydro One Infrastructure by necessity. INFO

 Hydro One noted concern regarding prolonged vehicle and pedestrian stoppages under Hydro One infrastructure in a roundabout configuration, vs a regular intersection. RVA noted that a roundabout will provide improved traffic flow and reduce queuing vs a signalized or 4way stop intersection configuration. INFO

• RVA to explore options to limit impacts to Hydro One corridor.










Existing Transportation Volumes (2022)






Alternative 1: Do Nothing

Intersection remains as is, with no improvements (prior to all-way stop temporary condition). Required to be considered as part of the EA planning & design process.

- ➤ Does not address insufficient stopping sightline distance caused by reverse curve alignment
- Does not address right-of-way conflict at Thirty Road / Clayson Road
- Does not address westbound traffic utilizing Clayson Road as cut-through





Alternative 2: Intersection Improvements & Close Clayson Road at Northern Terminus

Close Clayson Road and direct traffic to improved Thirty Road at Young Street intersection i.e., all-way stop, roundabout or traffic signal (to be confirmed in Phase 3).

- ✓ Addresses insufficient stopping sightline distance caused by reverse curve alignment at Young Street / Thirty Road (dependent on intersection control selected in Phase 3)
- ✓ Eliminates right-of-way conflict at Thirty Road / Clayson Road
- ✓ Addresses east bound traffic utilizing Clayson Road as cut-through
- √ N/S traffic flow is maintained
- ✓ Minimal impact to adjacent lands





Alternative 3: Improvements at Clayson Rd & Young St Intersections & Close Thirty Road Segment

Close north segment of Thirty Road and direct traffic to Thirty Road at Clayson Road Street intersection.

- ✓ Eliminates stopping sightline distance issues at Young Street / Thirty Road
- √ Removes right-of-way conflict at Thirty Road and Clayson Road
- Minimal-moderate property requirements (to be determined based on type of intersection control)
- ➤ Delays to N/S traffic flow
- Requires upgrades to Clayson Road and Young Street






Alternative 4: Realign Thirty Road North of Young Street

Segment of Thirty Road north of Young Street is closed and realigned with Clayson Road closed at northern terminus.

- ✓ Maintains N/S traffic flow
- ➤ Impacts watercourse and highly vulnerable aquifer
- Significant property impacts (bisects property north of Young)
- High cost to implement






Alternative 5: Extend Clayson Road South of Young Street

Clayson Road is extended south of Young Street. Segment of Thirty Road north of Young Street is closed and Thirty Road is cul-de-sac'd at southern terminus.

- ✓ Addresses stopping sightline distance issue at Young Street / Thirty Road
- ✓ Removes right-of-way conflict at Thirty Road / Clayson Road
- √ Maintains N/S traffic flow
- ➤ Significant property impacts including potential cultural heritage property (farm south of Young and 3049 Thirty Road)
- ➤ High cost to implement



The risk with roundabouts is that they are a form of an intersection where cars slow down considerably and even stop. There are also additional facilities such as pedestrian crosswalks on the periphery of the roundabout... result in cars or pedestrians being stopped underneath the transmission line for prolonged periods of time vs a regular road where cars and pedestrians cross quickly. Such an arrangement increases the risk profile for the road users from objects falling from the transmission line — most notable is ice in the winter, however it could be components of the towers or the conductors. 

Thanks for the timely response. Some additional clarification on your email below would be very helpful... as the roundabout option would best address the existing safety issue, satisfy traffic operations and reduce impacts to the adjacent landowners:

1. The attached correspondence from Hydro One notes that "...we have confirmed that Hydro One has existing high voltage Transmission facilities within your study area". Does that not refer to the large Towers running along the north side of Thirty Rd and Young St (identified in the Pics below)? No, we were referring to the vacant transmission corridor.



2. Re "The options which introduce roundabouts within our corridor lands may be more problematic and we would advise against those". Could you please elaborate on what you mean by problematic? le. Is this a hard "No"? the roundabouts may need to be pushed up (north I believe) so that they are outside the corridor footprint, however the roads connecting to them can be cross the corridor. The reason for that we have to

ensure that we can build a line safely when the need for it arises. Transmission lines going directly on top of a roundabout is usually a concern as it may not be safe for the road users.

Appreciate your prompt attention to this as it could have a significant impact on our proposed solution for the intersection.

On behalf of the project team, thank you for providing the information regarding existing Hydro One high voltage transmission facilities along the north side of Young Street and either side of Thirty Road, as well as the transmission corridor / Hydro One ROW located along the south of Young Street within the study area.

Please find attached a file highlighting the conceptual design alternatives we are currently considering. For ease of use, we have indicated all utility poles in Blue (local poles small blue dots, hydro One poll large blue dots), and all property lines in Green. Please note that these design alternatives are still conceptual in nature and may change prior to the PIC (March 9th), and that impacts identified may change as the study progresses and the design is refined. These alternatives were discussed Wednesday, at our Technical Agency Committee Meeting, however, Hydro One was unable to attend.

Currently the preliminary recommendation is to carry forward design concepts 2 and 3, which may result in impacts to ten existing local utility poles (small blue dots) on Young Street and Thirty Road and some impacts to Hydro One land to the south of the corridor as shown in the attached. Additionally, this would result in the road encroaching toward the transmission poles currently located within the Region's ROW and Region's property located on NE corner (Picture 1 below). Based on our understanding, we do not believe this would require any relocation of the poles, however, it is understood guard rail would need to be installed, similar to the current arrangement along Thirty Road.

Let me pull out some data regarding your question. Niagara Region recorded 14 accidents at this intersection in the last five years when we started the EA. Eleven out of them were categorized as "failing to the right of way" due to the lack of sight line at the intersection of Thirty Road and Young Street.

The 4-way stop is a temporary solution that was installed a few months ago and Region did not collect any accident yet. However, the planned closure of Clayson Rd will deteriorate traffic operation and safety at the current geometry of Thirty Rd and Young Street intersection due to transferring additional turning movement.







Thank you for your email, we appreciate your response and taking the time to review the report. Here are the answers to your questions:

- 1) Currently there are measures in place to mitigate impacts to green spaces and trees. I do not believe there are compensation measures in place to replace what is lost, beyond what will be re-established when disturbed. Tree removal should be fairly limited for this project as well.
- 2) The Snapping Turtle record is not within our Study Area and is a citizen science record from outside the area but within the general overall landscape. We did not observe any on site ourselves during site investigations.

It has been brought to our attention the Niagara Region, is assessing a road improvement plan regarding the intersection of Thirty Rd at Young St in the Town of West Lincoln. The road improvement plan has a potential negative impact on the Niagara Regional Wind Farm (NRWF) and supporting infrastructure. As you may know, Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC) is a 50% owner of NRWF. As such, we are formally raising our concerns regarding the improvement plan.

We understand Niagara Region is considering various options to ease the historical issues at the intersection, some of which include the potential relocation of three transmission poles supporting the NRWF project. SNGRDC understands from residents in the area that the current solution implemented with the 4-way stop has addressed the historical issues at the intersection.

As an Indigenous co-owner of the asset, SNGRDC has a responsibility and an obligation to mitigate any negative environmental impacts relating to the FWRN project. Most notably, we have concerns regarding the potential impacts of the relocation of transmission poles which will cause environmental impacts and further disturbances to the land. Specifically, if the transmission poles are relocated to the Spring Creek subwatershed of Twenty Mile Creek, there will be impacts to the subwatershed and the important ecological systems that exist. Before potential harm is caused to the Spring Creek subwatershed of Twenty Mile Creek, all alternatives should be considered, including the current status quo.

Lastly, as a 50% owner of NRWF, SNGRDC is concerned with the negative economic impact to the Six Nations community if the transmission poles need to be relocated. SNGRDC allocates the profit for our investment in NRWF to service community needs and priorities, any disruption to NRWF will directly impact our community.

It is our position that more time is needed to determine if the current all-way stop has addressed the concerns raised about Thirty Road at Young Street and Thirty Road at Clayson Road.

Environmental Assessment of Regional Road 14 (Thirty Road) at Young Street in the Township of West Lincoln, Ontario.

The Niagara Region is committed to working with Six Nations of the Grand River Development Corporation (SNGRDC), Six Nations of the Grand River Elected Chief, and Council in undertaking the Environmental Assessment for the intersection improvement and a potential realignment of Thirty Road at Young Street. The main objective of the study is to address the need for operational and safety improvements at the intersection.

The project is being completed as a Schedule "C" project in accordance with the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (*October 2000, amended in 2007, 2011 & 2015*), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Please note that no improvement has been recommended at this time, as the project team is currently evaluating Phase 3 Class EA alternative design concepts/intersection control types (i.e., all-way stop, roundabout, traffic signal). The intersection control options are being evaluated in consideration of the key constraints within the study area, including SNGDRC infrastructure to the north, Hydro One corridor lands to the south, regulated floodplain lands associated with the Spring Creek subwatershed to the north, adjacent residential properties, and prime agricultural lands.

It is noted that the all-way stop and signalized intersection control types would require significant realignment of Thirty Road north of Young Street in order to improve the stopping sight distance for southbound vehicles and provide a safe geometric design for road users. This realignment is also expected to have impacts on NRWF poles, residential properties/homes, Spring Creek watershed and associated regulated floodplains, and Prime Agricultural lands. The evaluation of impacts and costs associated with implementing intersection control options will consider impacts to the environment, community, and costs as a whole (i.e., not just costs incurred by the Region), including those incurred by SNGRDC.

The results of the evaluation, including the preferred design concepts/intersection control type, will be presented at the next Public Information Centre (PIC), anticipated to be held in Q4 of this year. The Region would be happy to review the fulsome evaluation, as well as the preliminary recommendation, with SNGRDC prior to the PIC once available.

Regarding the sufficiency of the interim all-way stop control addressing the historical issues at the intersection as a long-term solution, the 'Do Nothing' alternative, or maintaining the status quo, is also being considered in accordance with the EA process. As you correctly point out, this intersection was recently upgraded to an all-way stop (November 2022). While the all-way stop

control does appear to be an early safety improvement, and we're glad to hear that you've heard the same perspective from residents, the stopping sight distance issue for southbound vehicles is not resolved with the all-way stop control. Although the all-way stop control minimizes the collision risk under existing conditions when there is visibility, the collision risk is anticipated to increase with reduced visibility conditions and increase further expected increase in traffic volumes.

Any improvements recommended through the EA will be subject to the future Regional budget. Accordingly, at this time, the Region anticipates that the all-way stop will remain in place for the near and medium term, subject to the full results of the EA study. The Region will continue to monitor operations and then move forward with the recommendations of the EA if the current all-way stop is shown not to have addressed or reduced the frequency of collisions.

Further to the staggering percentage of angle collisions at the intersection, the review identified that eight (8) of the angle collisions included a westbound vehicle, six (6) of which were hit by vehicle travelling southbound along the spiral curve. It can be inferred from these numbers that sightline issues exist at this intersection for the westbound approach, largely due to the horizontal alignment of Thirty Road north of Young Street.
